I am in receipt of a letter from the CT Attorney General requesting information on my Sandy Hook relief fund. Here are the responses to the questions:

Name of Organization - Adopt A Sandy Hook/Newtown Cop Program

- 1. What is the approximate dollar amount of donations and pledges that your organization has received to date in response to the Sandy Hook tragedy? approx \$33,000.
- 2. Will these funds be used solely for victims of the Sandy Hook tragedy? Yes- 100%
- 3. Approximately how much has your organization spent to date on the Sandy Hook tragedy? We have donated \$21,000 to date with another \$10,000 being given to the police union fund on the first week of April.
- 4. What services has your organization provided to those affected by the Sandy Hook tragedy? we have donated to the Newtown police officers who have been struggling to return to work as a result of PTSD.

 What service does it expect to provide in the future? We will continue to fundraise to fatten up the union fund so the officers can take time off when they feel the need and still make their financial responsibilities.
- 5. Has your organization provided funding to other organizations for purposes related to the Sandy Hook tragedy? No, we are geared towards the 15 officers who were in the school on the day of the tragedy.
- 6. Has your organization provided, or does it intend to provide, direct financial assistance to individuals, families or businesses for Sandy Hook relief? No.. we are only assisting the Newtown PD through the union fund.
- 7. Does your organization have a plan in place on how to use any surplus funds not spent for Sandy Hook tragedy? Our plan is to continue to fundraise for as long as there is a need and ALL funds are given to the Newtown PD union president to be put in the union fund and distributed to the officers according to their needs.
