Location of Planting:

About 5 miles south of Grasonville, Maryland. Turn right at ATLANTIC gasoline station at western entrance to Grasonville. Proceed until observing a sign labeled LANDS END FARM on right side of road near a store at a crossroad. Follow arrows to farm, proceed past farmhouse to owners house. Main planting is on left of road approaching owners house. Farm is managed by Mr. Edwards, who is interested int the chestnut plantings.

Description of planting:

Trees are planted on a strip of land forming a peninsula. The soil appears to be good, although drainage conditions may not be favorable in some spots. The land is almost at water level but lack of air-frainage should be compensated for by the fact that there are bodies of water on either side of the plantings. Growth response is variable, from excellent to complete failure. Considerable evidence of rodent damage, mostly from mice and rabbits, was observed. There is considerable variation in the nut crop within the orchard. Some trees being heavily laden with nuts while others are bare. The plantings have been planted to clover for the past threex years and the undercover varies is between pure clover and pure wire grass. Mr. Edwards is concerned about the wire grass and is trying to destroy it in favor of the clover. Lime and super-phosphate in the amount of 300 lbs per acre was applied in the fall of 1985, no fertilizer was applied this year.

There are about 1000 trees in the planted area. Considerable evidence of severe damage by frost or freezing in 1945 was observed. Nuts are of good color and fair size. Those sampled were good to taste and peeled well. Nut drop appeared to have started about September 16, 1946. An apple orchard adjacent to the chestnut plantings has a heavy crop of fruit this season.

Remarks:

Bearing habits of 276 individual trees were rated by GFG and DCS. Sept. 18, 1946 with the following results:

No crop 141

Light Crop 67

Medium Crop 38

Heavy Crop 30

One tree was observed to have ap-like nuts and growth habit. This tree will be removed by Mr. Edwards on our recommendation. Six trees were observed to have upright growth tendencies worthy of further observation. Farm Address.
