Section 2: "Release Plan"

Category 1 – Resource Estimates

- 1. CISS is big, resources are stretched, estimates are too aggressive.
- Consider putting the Search Release on hold and focus on the Workflows.
- 3. There are resource constraints within agencies.
- 4. The release plan needs to be based on project estimates from a collaborative effort between agency stakeholders, CJIS and Xerox.
- 5. Agency resources need to be prioritized, allocated and funded.
- 6. Agency resources should co-locate with the CJIS team at times.
- 7. Assumptions have not been vetted by all stakeholders.
- 8. Resource estimates appear to be very optimistic.
- 9. Agency technical resource estimates are absent.

Category 2: Overlapping Schedules

- 1. Testing appears to overlap too often. New code seems to move into test before a release is finished.
- 2. UAR, Misdemeanors and Infractions all in one release?
- 3. Focus on workflows/information exchanges instead of search?
- 4. Uncertainty of defined timeline. (Start date, end date, all dates.)



Category 3: Commitment Without Schedule

- 1. Uncertainty of defined timeline. (Start date, end date, all dates.)
- 2. Agencies are generally busy, with seasons of peak activity that preclude focus on "outside" projects.
- 3. Agencies can't comment on dates until a firm restart date is established through the contract amendment process.



Category 4: Uncertainty About Schedule

- There are many unknown variables that will affect the CISS project estimates.
- Also complicating matters is that we do not know when we will be able to access CISS. So, it is impossible to provide any meaningful feedback.
- 3. It isn't clear what is required of the stakeholders or the RMS vendors.



Category 5: Stakeholder Involvement - Timing

- 2. Users should be included in testing as early as possible.
- 3. CISS project timeline will likely be running parallel with the *<Insert Agency Name Here>* Modernization Project.



Category 6: Infrastructure

- Concern that agencies are not ready to process/catch/integrate electronic data; this effort should be funded and part of the strategic plan for the State of CT.

Category 7: Other Concerns & Recommendations

- Recommend that release plan includes time for everyone to regroup to understand project, details, timelines, etc.
- Focus on issue to provide Workflow information to agencies, i.e. Probation and Parole.
- 3. The current release plan is too aggressive based on history and current project status.
- 4. Data sources for Search? Existence and "consumer" priorities.
- Costs for integration of information from CISS into agency systems, especially when the target system itself is undergoing upgrade or replacement.
