Dear Mr. Kenyon:

The purpose of this letter is to certify Connecticut's ambient concentrations of ozone for the 2009 ozone season. In accordance with 40 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Chapter 1 Part 58, I hereby certify that, to the best of my knowledge, Connecticut's ambient ozone concentration data and the quality assurance data collected from April 1, 2009 through September 30, 2009 have been submitted to EPA's Air Quality System (AQS) and the ambient data are accurate taking into consideration the quality assurance findings as designated in 40 CFR 58.15(a). We have attached a report of the ozone monitors to be certified, report AMP450 (40 CFR 58.15 (b)), and a summary report of the precision and accuracy data for each of the ozone monitors, report AMP255 (40 CFR 58.15(c)). These reports are dated prior to the signature date on this letter.

I also certify that the data collection procedures conformed to the applicable quality assurance, air monitoring methodology, probe siting criteria and reporting requirements in Part 58 of the CFR, Appendices A, C, E and F. During the period of January 1, 2009 through September 30, 2009, Connecticut did not record any air pollution incidents when ambient levels of ozone reached or exceeded levels specified in 40 CFR Subpart H, 51.151 that would cause significant harm to public health.
