PART C. Allowable Cleaning Solvents:

Any solvents or combination of solvents used must comply with all sections of this permit. Maximum Allowable Stack Concentrations (MASC) calculations outlined in Part H must be performed for any new solvents or combination of solvents used now or in the future. MASC calculations shall be maintained on site for a period of no less than three (3) years and submitted to the Bureau upon request.

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PART D. Operating Parameters:

Allowable Material to be Sprayed: Wood Cabinets

PART E. Stack Parameters:

Number of Stacks: 1

Minimum Stack Height Above Grade: 43 feet

Minimum Exhaust Flow Rate: 18000 acfm

Minimum Distance from the Nearest Property Line: 70 feet

PART F. Control Equipment:

Binks PFA-10-8-TLH Andrea filter floor mount booth.

Kingswood Kitchens, Inc. shall follow any stipulations and recommendations set by the vendor for maintaining the dry filters used in this coating booth. Dry filters must be inspected and replaced in accordance with Kingswood Kitchens' operator work instructions regarding painting operations. If a filter shows signs of clogging, cracking, or excessive deterioration, it shall be cleaned or replaced as recommended by the filter vendor. Filters shall be disposed in a manner consistent with all applicable Department of Environmental Protection Regulations.

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PART G. Future Permitting Requirements:

When an applicable Control Technology Guideline ((CTG) as determined by this Bureau), is published for this source category, the owner/operator of this source shall submit a permit application within thirty (30) days of notification by this Bureau that such CTG exists. The permit application shall include, but not limited to, a Best Available Control Technology (BACT) analysis consistent with the applicable CTG. Should the owner/operator fail to submit an acceptable permit application to this Bureau within the time frame specified, this permit may be revoked pursuant to Section 22a-174-3(i)(1) of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies (hereinafter referred to as the Regulations).

PART H. Hazardous Air Pollutant Compliance:

Coatings, diluents, or cleaners used by Kingswood Kitchens now or in the future, either for production or on a trial basis, which contain hazardous air pollutants that are regulated under Section 22a-174-29 of the Regulations, emitted from a stack are allowed provided that:

- a. The Permittee can demonstrate that the actual stack concentration of each hazardous air pollutant (HAP) emitted from the use of any such coating, diluent, or cleaner does not exceed the Maximum Allowable Stack Concentration (MASC) for each HAP using the following equation:

$$MASC = 16.38(HLV) \text{ at } 18000 \text{ actual cubic feet per minute (acfm)}$$

where MASC = Maximum Allowable Stack Concentration (ug/m<sup>3</sup>) for each HAP

HLV = Hazard Limiting Value (ug/m<sup>3</sup>) for each HAP 8 hour limit

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PART H. Hazardous Air Pollutant Compliance:

The MASC is derived using the hazardous air pollutant's corresponding HLV as listed in Section 22a-174-29 of the Regulations and the stack parameters in Part E of this permit.

The actual stack concentration (ASC) will be derived using each hazardous air pollutant's content in the compound (as applied lb hazardous air pollutant/gal) and the maximum application rate (gal/hr) as a worst case. This gives actual stack emissions in pph which can be converted to ug/m<sup>3</sup> (ug/m<sup>3</sup> = pph x 2.67E+8/acfm);

- b. This source must comply with the standard as outlined in Section 22a-174-20(f)(2) of the Regulations. If the standard is more stringent, then this supersedes the limit on the MASC values for each HAP;
- c. The change does not constitute a modification, as defined in Section 22a-174-1 of the Regulations;
- d. The Permittee keeps records of all compounds used, and MSDS's or technical data sheets; and
- e. The Permittee submits a report of any changes and a demonstration of compliance with permit limits, within thirty (30) days of such changes, to the Department of Environmental Protection, Bureau of Air Management, Permit Section, 79 Elm Street, Hartford, Connecticut 06010-5127.

The emissions from any new compounds, for production or trial runs, shall be counted toward any applicable emission limit in this permit.

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PART I. Recordkeeping Requirements:

1. Kingswood Kitchens shall maintain daily records of all coatings used so as to determine VOC emissions on a hourly, daily, monthly, and cumulative consecutive twelve (12) month basis. Such records must contain the following information:
  - a. Date coating used;
  - b. Description of the paint, including name and the density (lb/gallon);
  - c. List of volatile and non-volatile components and their associated weight percentage of the coating;
  - d. Quantity of coating used (gallons/hour and gallons/day);
  - e. Quantity diluent used (pounds, gallons);
  - f. Cumulative year-to-date record of coating usage (gallons) and VOC emissions; and
  - g. Data for determining VOC content and VOC emissions.
2. Kingswood Kitchens shall maintain a daily record of the type and quantity of any solvent that is used to clean the guns and booth. In addition, accurate daily records must be kept of the quantity and type of solvents spilled, evaporated, or manifested as waste material.
3. Records as required by this permit will be maintained on site for a period of no less than three (3) years and submitted upon request.

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PART J. Premise Requirements:

1. Operation of the spray booth as described in this permit will not cause or permit the emission of any substance or combination of substances which creates or contributes to an odor beyond the property boundary of the premise that constitutes a nuisance as defined under Section 22a-174-23 of the Regulations. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in the assessment of civil penalties and/or the issuance of a State Order.
2. Kingswood Kitchens shall cover all open drums and vessels that contain solvents, cleaners, or coatings. Empty containers shall be disposed of in a manner consistent with handling techniques for hazardous materials, if applicable.

PART K. Additional Terms and Conditions:

1. This permit does not relieve the permittee of the responsibility to conduct, maintain, and operate the regulated activity in compliance with all applicable requirements of any federal, municipal, or other state agency. Nothing in this permit shall relieve the permittee of other obligations under applicable federal, state, and local law.
2. Any representative of the DEP may enter the permittee's site in accordance with constitutional limitations at all reasonable times without prior notice, for the purposes of inspecting, monitoring, and enforcing the terms and conditions of this permit and applicable state law.
3. This permit may be revoked, suspended, modified, or transferred in accordance with applicable law.
4. This permit is subject to and in no way derogates from any present or future property rights or other rights or powers of the State of Connecticut.

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PART K. Additional Terms and Conditions, continued:

Connecticut and conveys no property rights in real estate or material, nor any exclusive privileges, and is further subject to any and all public and private rights and to any federal, state, or local laws or regulations pertinent to the facility or regulated activity affected thereby. This permit shall neither create nor affect any rights of persons of municipalities who are not parties to this permit.

5. Any document, including any notice, which is required to be submitted to the Commissioner under this permit shall be signed by a duly authorized representative of the permittee and by the person who is responsible for actually preparing such document, each of whom shall certify in writing as follows: "I have personally examined and am familiar with the information submitted in the documents and all attachments and certify that based on reasonable investigation, including my inquiry of those individuals responsible for obtaining the information, the submitted information is true, accurate, and complete to the best of my knowledge and belief, and I understand that any false statement made in this document or its attachments may be punishable as a criminal offense." Any false statement in any information submitted pursuant to this permit may be punishable as a criminal offense in accordance with Connecticut General Statutes subsection 22a-6, under subsection 53a-157 of the Connecticut General Statutes.

6. Nothing in this permit shall effect the Commissioner's authority to institute any proceeding or take any other action to prevent or abate violations of law, prevent or abate pollution, recover costs and natural resource damages, and to impose penalties for violations of law, including but not limited to violations of this or any other permit issued to the permittee by the Commissioner.

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PART K. Additional Terms and Conditions, continued:

7. Within fifteen days of the date of permittee becomes aware of a change in any information submitted to the Commissioner under this permit, or that any such information was inaccurate or misleading or that any relevant information was omitted, the permittee shall submit the correct or omitted information to the Commissioner.
8. The date of submission to the Commissioner of any document required by this permit shall be the date such document is received by the Commissioner. The date of any notice by the Commissioner under this permit, including but not limited to notice of approval or disapproval of any document or other action, shall be the date such notice is personally delivered or the date three days after it is mailed by the Commissioner, whichever is earlier. Except as otherwise specified in this permit, the word "day" means calendar day. Any document or action which is required by this permit to be submitted or performed by a date which falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday shall be submitted or performed by the next business day thereafter.
9. Any document required to be submitted to the Commissioner under this permit shall, unless otherwise specified in writing by the Commissioner, be directed to:
