
General Overview

- Title V of the Federal Clean Air Act (CAA) and the associated federal rules require states to establish annual fees based on criteria pollutant air emissions.
- The total fees collected must sufficiently cover the entire cost of developing and administering all of the state's Title V program requirements.
- The process for assessing emission fees is specified in §22a-174-26 of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies (RCSA).


Facts and Figures for 2018 Title V Fees

- Inventory Stabilization Factor (ISF)
 - If unadjusted by the DEEP Commissioner it would have been 15.36 or $(133,665/8,702)$.
 - Actual ISF for 2018 fees, as reduced by Commissioner Dykes, became 6.50.
- A total of 69 sites received Title V emission fee invoices for their 2018 emissions.
- All invoices were sent out by DEEP Air Bureau on or before May 16th, 2019.
- Per Section 22a-174-26, all 2018 Emissions Fees are due by July 1st, 2019.


Total Tons for all CT Title V Sources




Title V Fees Assessed (2007-2018)
