
- Avoided disposal costs

- Waste management activities account for approximately 3% of total U.S. GHG emissions.
 - A September 2009 EPA report states that combined material management is associated with an estimated 42% of total US GHG emissions.
- Waste reduction activities result in emission reduction benefits that are realized across multiple industry sectors.

MSW Life Cycle—Linear




MSW Life Cycle—Cyclical






- Partners can track

- Provides tangible benefit to Partners for improved data management






- Partners can report data for multiple locations

 - Climate Profile report sums the data for all locations






- Numerous materials are pre-loaded for reporting

 - Ability to add "Other" when material is not on the list





Re-TRAC Database


- Manage contact information within Re-TRAC like:
 - Name
 - Email
 - Address
- Partners can have multiple contacts
- Contacts can be limited to specific locations





Re-TRAC Database


- Access to Re-TRAC reports with real-time data




Benchmarking is Key to a Successful Energy Program



- Heighten awareness of energy use
- Identify billing errors
- Assess effectiveness of current operations, policies, practices
- Document environmental stewardship and demonstrate success
- More responsive management through more informed decision-making



U.S. EPA Energy Performance Rating System



Building Recognition



Top 25% of energyefficient buildings nationwide.

Use 35% less carbon dioxide and 35% less energy than their peers, on average



New England Healthcare Facilities are Using Energy Star

 So far, 161 New England hospital accounts have benchmarked energy performance using Portfolio Manager (CT-45, ME-20, MA-71, NH-14, RI-7, VT-4)

Benchmarking is the first step toward improving energy performance

- Four New England hospitals have earned ENERGY STAR Labels:
 - St. Francis, CT
 - VA West Haven, CT (Labeled in 2007, 2006 and 2002)
 - VA Jamaica Plain, MA (Labeled in 2003)
 - St. Mary's Regional Medical Center, ME (Labeled in 2009)

- New reporting feature
- You can extract & display information about your facilities & energy performance
- Prioritizes activities and investments, establishing more robust benchmarks, reporting to other groups, and conducting comparative analysis.
- Select from eight report templates and customize reports
- Report can be viewed as a data table or graph.
- Results can be exported in PDF, Excel, XML and CSV.
