

How do I Apply to Become a CER?

- ✓ Prospective Recyclers: submit NEW application with \$250 fee.

Important: Read instructions carefully and fill out ALL elements of ALL application forms. Incomplete applications will NOT be considered!

- 1) Go to www.ct.gov/DEEP/e-waste (save shortcut)
- 2) Click on [CT's E-Waste Recycling Law](#) box
- 3) Then click on [Recycler Information](#) box
- 4) Go to [CER Application Forms and Instructions](#)



- ✓ Current CERs: submit RENEWAL application only – no fee req'd.

Important: All application forms revised. Applicants must ONLY complete and submit newly revised forms for CT DEEP consideration. Submission of former application forms will be considered incomplete and may be rejected or denied.

- ✓ Submittal Timeframe: December 15, 2014 – February 13, 2015

Important: Any new or renewal application that is received by CT DEEP after 5pm EST on 2/13/15 will not be accepted [evidenced by date stamp or signature of receipt].



What Should be Submitted to CT DEEP?

New Application Submissions

- All forms must be completed in their entirety with supplemental information clearly marked / identified with title, section, etc. per [instructions](#)
- New applications must include:



- Application form – “New”, proposed fees, signed certification & payment
- Appropriate Applicant Background Info. (Att. A)
- Qualifications and Experience (Att. B)
- Detailed Procedures, Process Flow chart(s) (NEW) and Disclosures (Att. C)
- All Recycling & Disposal Facilities receiving MOCs (separate Att. D for each)
- All Initial Transporters & 10-Day or less facilities (separate Att. E for each)

Renewal Application Submissions

- Use same app. form – “Renewal”, proposed fees & signed certification, no supplemental info. required to be submitted*
- Check box in cert. statement that information previously submitted has not changed
- Attach Process Flow chart(s) (NEW)



*Use separate DEEP modification form for any change not previously approved per RCSA 22a-638-1(b)(8)or(9).



What Can I Expect from CER Review Process?

- A thorough review of each New Application/Renewal by CT DEEP's CER application review team [RCSA 22a-638-1(b)(5)(A)]:
 - Sufficiency: Only complete applications/renewals using new forms
 - Technical Review: Detailed written descriptions of process and material flow, Disclosures, Attachments, Process Flow chart(s)
 - Separate standard deviation calculations for proposed fees
- Proposed Timeframe (Approvals/Denials/Withdrawals):
 - Proposed Issuance by April 1, 2015, if not sooner
- Issuance of Extensions for Current CERs:
 - Extend current approvals to April 30, 2015 including current pricing
 - Municipalities need min. of 30-day bridge to enter into new agreements



What will be Length of CER Approvals?

- Proposed Timeframe for Issuance of New CER Approvals [RCSA 22a-638-1(b)(5)(B)]:
 - 1-year CER Approval Period - April 2015 to April 2016
 - Note: Each year CT DEEP plans to open 60-day recycler application period in December – February to receive new and renewal applications



Common Deficiencies & Other Issues of Concern

- See Notice for Common Deficiencies
[Notice of 60-day Recycler Open Application Period](#)
- *Draft Policy on Management of CRT Glass*
 - CRT glass from CEDs shall be recycled whenever possible
 - Disposal is intended to be minimized with hierarchy of waste management strategies in CT [CGS 22a-228(b), RCSA 22a-638-1]
 - Alternate Daily Cover (“ADC”) is considered disposal not recycling
 - At this time, ADC is not acceptable option and grounds denial of permit or application
 - Stockpiling/long term storage is not considered recycling
