


Q1 Please select the most common types of non-RCRA HW ("CR05") and any Special Wastes generated at your facility from the list below (check all that apply):







Q4 Are the CR05 and Special Wastes generated at your facility from question 1 being sent to a facility in Connecticut for disposal?


