Most manifests... (~ 97%)



... are still stored in paper format




Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection

~ 3% manifests have been scanned

Scanned images from 3 years:

- 2012 - 2014
- Stored in “Filenet”
 - electronic document repository
- Accessible in DEEP Records Center computers



2-year plan:

100% digital by 2018

- Scan all remaining paper manifests
 - ~ 1.2 million+
 - Scanning contractor already started
- Federal E-Manifest system
 - Still planned for 2018 start
 - manifests generated and stored electronically by EPA



What do I do until 2018?

2 sources to search to get copies:

- 1) Manifest FOIA (1984 – 2008)
- 2) Filenet (2012 – 2014)

NOTE: Unavailable –

- 1981 – 1984; 2009 – 2011; 2015 – present
- in boxes / not in any database



Where are these data available?

Data Source	Years	DEEP Records Center	<i>On Line</i>
Manifest FOIA	1984 - 2008	Yes	<i>Yes</i>
Filenet	2012 - 2014	Yes	No

- Replaces ftp site download
- “giant spreadsheet” – easier to search
- Downloadable - ~ 900,000 records / 35 Mb
- ONLY data from Manifest FOIA 1984 - 2008
- Still need to visit DEEP for Filenet 2012 - 2014
