



- Successfully complete actions totaling 200 or more points.

2018 Silver Certification




- Complete at least 1 action in each of the 9 categories.


Points Based on Level of Impact






















Materials Management Actions

- Report Materials Management Data and Reduce Waste: Establish baseline municipal data by tracking and measuring (as required by state law) the amount of residential municipal solid waste generated and recycled per capita, educate and engage the public by disseminating that data, and ultimately, reduce residential solid waste.
- Implement Save Money and Reduce Trash (SMART) Program: Reduce residential trash generation.
- Recycle Additional Materials: Reduce residential solid waste and increase recycling of non-mandated materials.
- **Develop a Food Waste Reduction Campaign**: Be a community free of food waste.


