



Social Services


- Social Service Office provides emergency food boxes, rent, utility, and prescription medicine assistance


Jobs & Vocational Training

Why Mattresses?

- Take up a lot of space in landfills
- Do not compact well
- Create flammable air pockets
- Springs from mattresses can damage equipment



Rebuilding



Mattresses and boxsprings are stripped of their component parts:

- Steel
- Wood
- Cotton
- Foam





Resulting commodities are shipped
to recyclers

80-90% of mattress components are
recyclable if they are separated




Gross Receipts 1983-2009
