## **Notice of Reissuance without Modifications**

## General Permit for the Discharge of Stormwater and Dewatering Wastewaters from Construction Activities

Pursuant to section 22a-430b of the Connecticut General Statutes (CGS), the Commissioner of the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection ("DEEP") hereby provides notice of the reissuance *without modifications* of the General Permit for the Discharge of Stormwater and Dewatering Wastewaters from Construction Activities (construction general permit).

This general permit authorizes discharges from certain construction activities based on the amount of land disturbed by the activity. The general permit requires registration by the activity, development and implementation of a Stormwater Pollution Control Plan and stormwater inspections and outfall turbidity monitoring during a rain storm.

The current industrial general permit expires on September 30, 2019. A Notice of Tentative Decision to reissue the current general permit *without modifications* was published in six newspapers statewide on August 19 and August 23, 2019. No comments were received within the public comment period. This general permit *without modifications* is **reissued for the period from October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2020**.

No re-registration is required for this reissuance <u>without modifications</u>. The general permit's inspection and outfall turbidity monitoring programs will continue in effect during this reissuance period.
