Create a Police Toolkit	 Sarah Ali reported on the Police Toolkit workgroup. Representatives from the workgroup met with the New London, Hartford, New Haven, and Enfield police representatives to obtain their input in the development of a toolkit and their local opioid epidemic experience. Police representatives suggested have access to the DMHAS 800# (Access Line) instead of having a list of specific local resources. More input will be gathered from different police departments, possibly around the west and south side of the state.
