Participant Updates	<ul> <li>SB 483 - Judicial Branch required to report by 1/1/19 the feasibility of establishing opioid intervention courts in the state. It was noted that drug courts are expensive and CT achieves much of the same impact with existing programming available in court. Some drug court models allow judges to require specific medications which crosses professional boundaries.</li> <li>SB 483 – ADPC required to convene a working group to evaluate methods of combating the opioid epidemic in the state and report by 1/1/19.</li> <li>SB 483 – DOC required to report on its MAT pilot and details for possible expansion to all inmates by 1/15/19.</li> <li>Sharlene Croteau announced that the CT State Police are presenting an educational forum on illicit drugs and the CSP's CRISIS initiative to connect people to substance use services. Sharlene Croteau announced that Wheeler Clinic and UConn Health Center have received a mini-grant to assess patient outcomes in MAT. They will implement MyStrength, an evidence based application, which uses CBT, relapse prevention, mindfulness etc. and tracks individual progress.</li> </ul>
