1. Welcome & Introductions	The meeting was convened at 1:00 PM and began with introductions and review and approval of minutes.	Minutes were approved with no revisions.
2. Federal Grant Updates	<p>SAMHSA Partnership for Success 2015: Mid-way point of grant, awardees all on task with social media campaigns. Student surveys to be administered, including use of non-medical prescription drugs so will see data later on in grant. Beginning sustainability planning.</p> <p>CDC Rx Drug Overdose Grant 4.25.18 is date for conference, registration already filling quickly. Capacity is 325.</p> <p>SAMHSA Strategic Prevention Framework for Rx Drugs Grant Kicked off Change the Script campaign in February. Intend to expand and target additional populations and media outlets. 4 specific health districts are fully funded. DCP continues to improve PDMP system data. Utilization by providers has increased to 45%. Will be conducting another survey of users/prescribers. UCHC continues to evaluate. This PSEI Subcommittee is the advisory group to this grant, with a smaller implementation group making decisions and providing oversight to the grant.</p> <p>SAMHSA State Targeted Response Grant Prevention activities: NARCAN training and kits being done/distributed. Regional Behavioral Health Action Organizations (RBHAOs) are the new configuration of previous RACS and Regional Mental Health Boards. Law Enforcement conference happening 4/5/18. Completed parent trainings in English/Spanish. 13 college campuses and 65 community coalitions have been funded to increase awareness of OUD. Continue to manage the ctdrugfree.org website. Change the Script campaign is on Governor website. Year 2 of STR federal funding will for the most part continue the efforts of Year 1. CROSS initiative started Youth Recovery Support initiative and began Smart Recovery groups throughout the state. 3. HB-7052 Recommendations for Safe Disposal	States ADPC shall commence a workgroup for 1 st responders, others to dispose of medications upon an individual's death. Recommend "double sign off" as part of this process and consideration for how drugs are disposed. This Sub-committee is tasked with this, past deadline.	C. Meredith will consult with ADPC planning staff for advice and direction.
4. Approved PSEI Recommendations	Approved by full ADPC committee. Need to determine product/goal of recommendations and how to achieve actions steps, such as: #1) Document with suggested curricula at different age levels for opioid prevention in school settings. Challenge of finding EBPs that exist for youth prevention specific to opioid use. #2) Seeking to conduct survey education system on use of Narcan. Consider legislation. 3#) expand Narcan education/distribution. RBHAOs, for example can do more trainings. Challenge of dissemination of kits which should be given to those in need, especially to trainees who can obtain it via insurance options.	C. Meredith will ask the CAPT for assistance in identifying EBPs. J. Stonger will draft explanation of intent of survey for SDE to distribute. Determine who from DPH would be legislative liaison to discuss Narcan in schools legislation. C. Meredith/M. Painter to bring back to full ADPC planning meeting for further discussion. Will be back on agenda for next meeting.
5. Voluntary Non-Opioid Directive (VNOD)	Sub-group would work on increasing community knowledge/awareness on this.	DPH will reach out to PSEI members to schedule follow up meeting
6. Other/Updates	National Prevention Week events – Capitol Press Conference and Health Fair on May 14 th and Hartford Yard Goats event on May 19 th . There is a possibility of SAMHSA involvement in the weeklong celebrations. GPP received preliminary notification of approval of their AmeriCorps proposal. Healthcare Compliance Packaging presentation planned for next ADPC meeting.	I.
