Mobile Crisis Team/Intake/Brief Treatment: (860) 297-0999

Mobile Crisis provides assessment/referrals' to individuals in the community experiencing a psychiatric crisis. Services are available Monday-Friday from 8:00 am to 8:30 pm. Intake and Brief Treatment services are available during our regular business hours. Individuals can self-refer or be referred from a local hospital or community provider. Brief Treatment is available, depending on the individual's needs.

Inpatient Treatment Unit

16 bed adult inpatient psychiatric unit providing intermediate and longer term inpatient care to people who require a longer length of stay in order to stabilize psychiatric symptoms and or who have complex discharge planning needs.

Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) Team

ACT provides assertive community outreach, treatment and engagement to people who may have struggled with living in the community and who require more intensive supports in order to succeed. Services are available from 8:00 am to 6:00 pm during the business week.

HOPE Team (Homeless Outreach and Positive Engagement)

HOPE works with homeless individuals who live in Hartford shelters or on the streets and provides outreach, clinical services, engagement and case management.

Forensics Services

Forensics provides specialized clinical services for people involved in the criminal justice system including court based mental health diversion programs as well as ongoing clinical services for people with significant criminal justice involvement.

Outpatient Clinic

The Outpatient Clinic consists of three intensive, interdisciplinary treatment teams for people with severe mental illness who may also have issues with substance use and trauma. They provide a range of services including individual therapy or counseling, group therapy, medication management, Dialectic Behavior Therapy, Integrated Dual Diagnosis treatment, and other evidence based practices.

Young Adult Services (YAS)

YAS is a specialized program providing a range of services to young adults 18-25 who have or are transitioning out of DCF services with long histories of foster care and/or residential care. Services are available seven days a week and include clinical care, vocational services, case management, and housing supports.

Hilltop (YAS)

Ten bed residential program for young adults who require a supportive transitional residence in order to assist them with developing the skills to live independently.

Deaf & Hard of Hearing Team (D&HoH)

D&HoH is a highly specialized service for people who are deaf or hearing impaired and have a persistent behavioral health concern. All program staff utilize American Sign Language and provide a range of services including clinical care, medication management, case management and vocational services. The program admits people across the entire region.

Housing Services

The program administers a range of housing assistance programs for CRMHC and other network providers including Shelter Plus Care, Housing Assistance Funds and other program to help people obtain and maintain their housing.

Behavioral Health Home (BHH)

For those people meeting criteria, the BHH provides an integrated healthcare delivery model that creates access to interdisciplinary primary and behavioral health care to improve health outcomes and, where possible, reduce the cost of services. It focuses on wellness and community-based supports.



Community Support Program

The Community Support program provides community-based skill building designed to assist with the development of effective living skills. All services are based on individualized assessment and planning. Services are available on weekdays from 8:00 am to 7:00p pm and after hours by arrangement.

Peer Support Services/Resource Center

The Drop- in Center at CRMHC is staffed by persons in recovery, who provide a range of services including education, advocacy, and access to computers, groups, and social activities.

Advocacy

Provides assistance to people seeking a solution for concerns with their clinical provider or manage a grievance and also assists with the development of person-centered recovery plans.
