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

The above-captioned matter was heard as a contested case on October 11, 2016, at which time the complainant and the respondents appeared, stipulated to certain facts and presented testimony, exhibits and argument on the complaint. A report of hearing officer was issued on April 20, 2017, concluding that the respondents had not violated the Freedom of Information Act as alleged and recommending a dismissal of the complaint on the merits.
