The additional improvements to the East Hartford levee, as required pursuant to the Provisionally Accredited Levee Agreement (PAL) with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, will bring the levee up to a FEMA appropriate level of safety.

Pursuant to Section 2 of Public Act 07–162, these funds are requested to finance the acquisition of development rights to Connecticut farms statewide under Chapter 422a, The State Program for the Preservation of Agricultural Land.

The funds will be used to purchase development rights in perpetuity to qualifying farms under the State's Farmland Preservation Program. Interests acquired under this program will ensure the farmland is available for farming and food production purposes and the preservation of these arable agricultural lands and adjacent pastures, woods, natural drainage areas and open space vistas are vital for the well-being of the people of the Connecticut. Offers are negotiated and presented by the Commissioner and if accepted, a report is presented to the State Properties Review Board for their review and approval of the acquisition of development rights. Upon the SPRB approval, A-2 surveys are commissioned of the farms and attorneys are assigned by the Attorney General's Office to represent the State in the acquisition. All conveyance documents are also reviewed and approved by the Attorney General's Office.

The release of these funds will be controlled through the allotment process on an individual farm basis. It is anticipated that these monies will finance the acquisition of development rights for approximately 10 farms statewide.
