Dear Comptroller Lembo:

The following information on the State's General Fund for fiscal year 2013 is provided in accordance with Section 4-66 of the General Statutes. In addition, an analysis of the Special Transportation Fund is included due to the significant nature of this fund. Consistent with Executive Order No. 1 issued January 5, 2011, these projections reflect the state's estimated year-end balance in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) as well as an estimated balance from operations on a budgetary basis.

### **General Fund**

We are projecting the General Fund will remain in balance as per the budget plan. However, it is important to note that, while limited expenditure data exists at this early point in the fiscal year, unfavorable expenditure trends appear to be developing in a small number of agency accounts as detailed below. In addition, significant uncertainty remains with regard to the national and global economic picture. Careful attention to these factors will be required as the year progresses.

The adopted budget includes a \$3.1 million balance from operations, an amount insufficient to freeze the current GAAP deficit which is estimated at \$1.7 billion. If a surplus develops this fiscal year, up to \$50.0 million must be reserved by the Comptroller to be applied to the GAAP deficit per Sec. 46 of Public Act 11-48, with the remainder dedicated to redeeming Economic Recovery Notes issued to finance the FY 2009 deficit in accordance with Sec. 511 of Public Act 09-3, June Special Session.

### Revenues

Given that it is very early in the fiscal year, our revenue projections this month remain unchanged relative to the adopted budget. However, the revenue forecast that underlies the fiscal 2013 budget assumes an accelerating national economic expansion which currently remains elusive. Furthermore, the likelihood of political brinksmanship at the national level surrounding potential sequestration and expiration of several policies increases the level of uncertainty in our revenue forecast.

### **Expenditures**

We are currently projecting that expenditures will be in line with appropriated levels. However, expenditures trends have developed in several agencies that will demand close

monitoring over the coming months and may impact future expenditure projections. In particular, caseload and utilization trends in the Medicaid program will need to significantly moderate from their current pace in order for spending in the Medicaid accounts to remain within available appropriations. Finally, Personal Services cost trends in the departments of Correction and Emergency Services and Public Protection are currently running above the levels that can be supported by available appropriations.

### **Special Transportation Fund**

In the Special Transportation Fund, estimated revenues and expenditures remain unchanged relative to the adopted budget. We anticipate the fund balance on June 30, 2013 to be \$146.3 million.

It is important to note that this represents the first projection of the State's General Fund and Transportation Fund position for FY 2013. While these projections are the best that can be made at this time, estimates may need to be adjusted as the year progresses to reflect changes in the economy, expenditure patterns, and/or other factors.
