## JUSTIFICATION FOR FAC TRANSFER DIVISION OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE

TRANSFER FROM: \$330,730 PERSONAL SERVICES (10010)

TRANSFER TO: \$330.730 OTHER EXPENSES (10020)

#### **DESCRIPTION OF TRANSFER REQUEST:**

The Division of Criminal Justice is requesting a transfer of \$330,730 from its Personal Services appropriation to its Other Expenses account to cover operational expenses whose costs will exceed the current available General Fund appropriation.

We would appreciate consideration of this request at the April, 2008 meeting of the Finance Advisory Committee.

#### JUSTIFICATION:

Expenses for commodities, supplies and services are expected to exceed the net allotment in the Other Expense account. Inflationary factors, unanticipated expenses associated with investigations and prosecutions critical to the agency's mission, the loss of the state's low-cost major office supply contractor mid-way through the fiscal year, as well as increases in fuel, some utilities, and repair and maintenance of agency offices and aging fleet vehicles have contributed to these costs.

We request a transfer from the Personal Services account which, at present, is expected to have a surplus in excess of \$800,000. The expected surplus in Personal Services is attributable to savings from military, maternity, and medical leaves, an active voluntary leave program, and lapsed salaries resulting from timing gaps in filling vacant positions.

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Reallocate funds from Senior Food Vouchers and WIC Program for Fresh Produce for Seniors to WIC Coupon Program for Fresh Produce.

WIC Farmers' Market Nutrition Program Deficit

In 2007, the state Legislators allocated \$400,000, Public Act 07-1, for an expanded state Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Program (SID# 12421). The state is already funding \$110,000 for the Senior FMNP. Because of the late date of this allocation, we could not fully utilize these new funds. The Department of Agriculture is proposing to reallocate \$145,384.10 of the unspent state Senior Food Voucher funds (SID# 12421) and unspent WIC Program For Fresh Produce-Seniors (SID# 16002) in the amount of \$20,215.14 to cover the total shortage of \$165,599.24 in the WIC Coupon Program—Fresh Produce (SID # 16075). The \$165,599.24 shortage consists of cumulative deficit from years prior to 2007 (\$63,648.91) and deficit from program year 2007 (\$101,950.33).

For the farmers' market season 2008 (Fiscal year 2009) we have applied for additional federal funds (USDA-FNS WIC FMNP). For the last two years the USDA has cut funding for this program, causing insufficient funds for eligible participants in this program. The additional funds we have applied for would bring CT FMNP to 2005 funding levels which would enable us to serve all eligible WIC clients state wide. If we don't receive additional federal funds, we are proposing to eliminate three of the four WIC categories, including: pregnant women, breast feeding women, and post partum women causing approximately 12,000 women to miss out on WIC FMNP benefits. This leaves approximately 36,000 children as the only category receiving the WIC FMNP benefits. The only other option would be to reallocate state Senior FMNP funds to provide benefits for those other three categories of WIC clients.

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The Office of the Chief Medical Examiner has a recognized deficiency of \$125,000 in its medicolegal investigations account due to higher than anticipated use of contracted assistant medical examiners and their related costs because of delays in hiring permanent full time staff to perform those functions. The delays in hiring have resulted in a lapse in the Personal Services account which will be used to cover the anticipated shortfall in the Other Expenses and Medicolegal Accounts.

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To transfer funds between SID's to make 4th quarter payments.

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# PROPOSED ITEM FOR APPROVAL BY THE FINANCE ADVISORY COMMITTEE April 3, 2008

The Department of Children and Families requests approval to transfer lapsing funds to cover anticipated deficits in three accounts. An anticipated deficit in the Adoption Account of \$1,500,000 is the result of a forecasted increase of 179 adoptions, 121 subsidized guardianships and 91 medically complex subsidy placements over FY07. An anticipated deficit of \$750,000 in the No-Nexus Account is the result of tuition increases for educational services. In addition, a deficit of \$1,200,000 is projected in the Individualized Family Support Account as a result of increased supports provided to in-home families.

The deficits outlined above will be covered by a projected lapse in the Board & Care – Residential account. A lapse of \$3,450,000 is anticipated as a result of delays in implementing group homes.
