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### Trends in criminal justice


- Reduction in index crimes 2008 to 2013: 18.2%
- Reduction in criminal arrests 2009 to 2014: 27.3%
- Reduction in prison population 2010 to 2015: 10.4%
- Reduction in minority prison population 2010 to 2015: 15.1%
- Reduction in total releases, 2007-2010 v. 2011-2014 : 11.6%
- Reduction in prison admits 2009 to 2014: 20.7%
- Reduction in pre-trial admits 2009 to 2014: 18.8%
- Decline in the number of <u>new</u> people admitted to prison on pre-trial status, 2008 to 2013: 32%

# Trends in criminal justice (2)


- Reduction in EOS releases 2009 to 2014: 20.3%
- Reduction in parole releases 2009 to 2014: 53.2%
- Reduction in TS releases 2009 to 2014: 33.3%
- Reduction in DOC remands 2009 to 2014: 22.3%
- Reduction in adult probation 2009 to 2014: 25.2%
- Reduction in urban\* homicides 2011 to 2014: 42%
- Reduction in fatal urban\* shootings 2011 to 2014: 50.7%
- Reduction in urban\* shootings 2011 to 2014: 29.4%


### Total index crimes – CT UCR, 1960 - 2013




### **Reduction in Violent Crime**



### Reduction in GA caseloads, FY 2010 to FY 2014




### Murders in Connecticut 1960 - 2013




# Intimate partner homicides





#### **Juvenile courts**




The number of juveniles referred to the court is down 21.3% since 2007, despite full implementation of Raise the Age.


Raise the age became effective for 16-year olds on January 1, 2010. It became effective for 17-year olds on July 1, 2012.




# **Population: York C.I. Jan. 1, 2006-2015**



# CT DOC Daily Population Jan. 2011- Jan 2015




## Racial disparity in the prison population



### **Reduction in 18-21 Cohort**




### CT Population, Males, & age at first DOC Admit



- With the exception of the Hispanics, growth in the state's population has been relatively modest over the last 10 years
- If this assumption is correct, demographic trends suggest that the state will have fewer young male adults in the coming years.
- The peak age for young men in Connecticut during the last five years has moved from 17 to 22.
- The most common age at which young men enter the prison system, on pre-trial status, is 20.

### **DOC admissions 2005 - 2014**




### New Pre-trial DOC admits 2008 - 2013




- 2008: 4302, 2013: 3914; 32% decrease




## DOC community supervision 2005 - 2014




# Recidivism among prisoners






# Recidivism among adult probationers



The 24-month rearrest rate for those under the supervision of adult probation has decreased by seven percentage points since 2007. This represents a 15% reduction and equates to over 1,700 fewer adult probationers rearrested annually.


