Connecticut Partnership for Long-Term Care April – June 2007

PARTNERSHIP EXPANSION CONTINUES

Last *Quarterly Update* we noted that the Deficit Reduction Act (DRA) of 2005 removed restrictions that had been in place since 1993 on new states who wished to develop Partnership for Long-Term Care programs. With these restrictions lifted, the DRA set the stage for Partnerships to expand to new states. Last *Update* we noted that three new states, **Florida**, **Idaho** and **Minnesota** had received approval to implement Partnership programs. We are pleased to report that five additional states have received approval – **Colorado**, **Georgia**, **Nebraska**, **Nevada** and **Virginia** – bringing the total of new Partnership states to eight.

Two more states, **Kansas** and **North Dakota** have applied for federal approval for a Partnership plan and there are likely close to 15 other states who are interested in developing a Partnership plan. We will provide updates to you as more states receive federal approval for a Partnership program.

The only new state where Partnership policies are currently being sold is Idaho. The rest of the states are in the process of developing their Partnerships and hope to have policies available sometime later this year.

Sometime in 2007, the federal Department of Health and Human Services will be developing standards for reciprocity between Partnership states. Our hope is that these standards will lead to more reciprocal agreements along the lines of the agreement Connecticut currently has with Indiana for the granting of Medicaid Asset Protection. We will provide you with updated information on reciprocity as it becomes available to us.

PARTNERSHIP SALES CONTINUE TO GROW

In the quarter ending December 31, 2006, total Partnership sales passed the **43,000** level with **43,502** sold to date. In addition, **over 800** Partnership applications were submitted, bringing the total number of applications to more than **53,359**.

93% of purchasers are under the age of seventy and 79% under the age of 65. The average age at time of purchase is 58 and the average maximum benefit purchased is \$229,997. In addition, over \$32 million in Medicaid Asset Protection has been earned as of 12/31/06 by Partnership policyholders receiving benefits under their policies. COST OF LONG-TERM CARE IN CONNECTICUT

The Partnership's publication, *Cost of Long-Term Care in Connecticut*, has been revised to reflect updated nursing facility and home care costs. The average private pay rate for a semi-private nursing facility room increased **5.2%** from last year to **\$299 per day** or over **\$109,000 per year**.
