Language Objectives

Language objectives define the language students need to access the grade-appropriate content

When planning student language objectives, consider the following:

- O What are the desired content outcomes?
- What are the desired outcomes for all language domains—speaking, listening, reading, and writing?
- O How do the content standards correspond to the CELP Standards?
- What kinds of challenges would a text present to students—reading levels, comprehension, and/or cultural context?
- Which vocabulary words need to be taught explicitly, so that students can participate in discussion, answer questions, and comprehend what they will read?
- O What grammatical structures need to be employed to accurately express the content?
- o How can reading strategies or metacognitive strategies be modeled for the students?
- What strategies can be implemented to help student produce writing?

Four Steps to Writing an Effective Language Objective:

- 1. Determine what vocabulary and grammatical structures are essential to the lesson or content objective.
- 2. Describe activities that students will DO in order to demonstrate what they KNOW about the vocabulary.
- 3. Utilize one or more of the language domains (speaking, listening, reading, and writing).
- 4. Align lesson activities to higher order thinking skills



Language Objective Examples

Content Objective:

Students will be able to compare and contrast the themes and structures of mysteries.

Language Objectives:

- Students will be able to **write** a <u>reflection</u> of the **discussion** that <u>explains</u> their thinking about the <u>similarities and differences</u> of the *themes* and *structures* of the stories.

Content Objective:

Students will be able to use maps to determine elevation of a place.

Language Objective:

- Students will be able to **verbally explain** how the *topography* <u>corresponds</u> to the *elevation* in a *location* by using comparative adjectives.

Content Objective:

Students will be able to order rational numbers.

Language Objectives:

- Students will be able to **write** number sentences <u>comparing</u> rational numbers using <u>greater than</u> or <u>less than</u> in words and *symbols*.

Content Objective:

Students will be able to trace the flow of energy through a food web.

Language Objectives:

- Students will be able to **read** and interpret symbols in a *food web*.
- Students will be able to **describe orally and in writing** how *energy* <u>flows</u> from the sun to *producers* and *consumers*.
