- Personnel development activities
- Policy updates
- Resource availability
- Information exchange and data gathering regarding best practices; and networking opportunities across districts on paraeducators and effective practices.

The CSDE asks that the monthly newsletter be disseminated to all paraeducators, teachers, and administrators throughout the district to clarify the roles of paraeducators and to ensure their appropriate training and supervision.
