
Use the Coach Tools to view progress and practice on Official SAT Practice for classes and individual students.



Teachers and Counselors – Get Started:


Step 1: Use this link: http://khan.co/2yZGPh4 as a guide to create classes in Khan Academy that have "SAT Reporting Enabled." Consider creating a class for each period that you teach, or for your case load of students.

*Though there is no limit to class size, performance will slow down with classes that are larger than 100 students.

*Remember: Classes cannot be shared amongst coaches; only one coach per class. You might consider creating one Coach account that can be shared with your colleagues/team members.

Step 2: Add Students and Become their Coach. Students will be prompted to approve you as a Coach when they log into Khan Academy.


*Use the Students tab in the Coach Dashboard to check that students have approved you as a coach; "pending" students have not approved you as a Coach.



Step 3: Gather Student Permissions to see their SAT Practice data. Students will be prompted to approve data sharing when they are logged in to Khan Academy and go to satpractice.org.

*Scroll to the bottom of your SAT Tab to see:

- How many minutes students practiced, questions they've completed, and if they are linked to the College Board.
- If the student has given you permission to their SAT practice data, they will appear in the roster. If listed at the bottom, you need to request data sharing again so that their information will appear in your SAT tab.



School & District Leaders - Get Started:

Option 2: Follow the steps for teachers and counselors to create your own classes, administered by the district.

There are a few ways you might want to create classes:

- School Leaders could consider organizing classes by graduating class; by last name (A-F, G-J, M-Z); or by homeroom teacher.
- District Leaders could consider organizing by school and teacher; by cohort; by last name (A-F, G-J, M-Z).
 - For instance, you might create a class called SchoolA2020A-F and enroll using Google classroom all the students in School A who are in the class of 2020 with a last name starting with A through F.
