
HERE, STUDENTS SUCCEED





Our students can choose from a wide range of areas to study and incorporate innovation and creativity to guide their learning, explore their interests, and discover their passions:

- Academics: AP/ECE Offerings, Advanced Mathematics, Robotics, World Languages
- Fine Arts: Band, Orchestra, Chorus, Ceramics, Digital Photography, Theater
- Creative Electives: Culinary Arts, Medical Careers, Outdoor Adventure Activities
- Athletics: Full array of competitive high school sports
- Extended Learning: Student-designed personalized learning experiences, clubs, service learning organizations, summer credit earning programs

Students are engaged, feel respected and like school:

- High school surveys show a 16% increase in students reporting a positive school climate
- Treating all students with dignity and respect, and using Restorative Practices has led to an overall **76% decrease in the need for disciplinary actions**

OUR CARE

Our faculty and staff take a personal interest in every student, supporting students in the school, on the field, and in the community:

- 9th Grade Transition Specialists help incoming students adjust to high school, making them feel welcome and comfortable
- Teachers use the *Getting to Know You* survey to personalize learning, and encourage and motivate students to explore their interests and develop their passions
- Counselors provide opportunities to explore college and career options, helping students pave their way toward success

SBAC Math scores GREW 7.1% SBAC ELA scores GREW 3.9%

OPPORTUNITY GROWS

Our middle school students can earn high school credits:

- Up to four credits offered in Young Adult Literature, Creative Writing/ Journalism, Algebra 1, Integrated Physical Science, and Spanish 1
- Summer Bridge Program supports high school transition while earning credit

Our high school students earn college credits:

- With no prerequisites or minimum GPA, there are no barriers to learning
- Students have entered college with as many as 30 credits
- On average, the graduating class earns a total of nearly 300 college credits
