As a literacy specialist you not only work with students and teachers, but you also are given a very broad range of responsibilities that would make it difficult to list under one certificate. Also, for those of us who would have to return to school for required coursework, it would be a discouragement to seek the endorsement, as with the current economy being at an all time low it would definitely be a hardship for people as many of them might not be able to afford the costs incurred to meet the requirements for the certification. Currently, literacy specialists receive numerous amounts of professional development in current literacy practices and research based programs that educate us better than a classroom course would to effectively do our jobs.
