Review of Regional School Transportation System Supporting *Sheff* Programming

RFP # 16-SDE-0001

PURPOSE: Engage an experienced transportation vendor or consulting firm that will assist the Connecticut State Department of Education with assessing the effectiveness of the current regional school transportation system supporting *Sheff* programming from both a ridership standpoint and cost standpoint

- Are all the routes and student addresses housed in one routing software program? Yes
- What is the routing software(s) being used for all 800 routes? **Transfinder's Routefinder**
- Are all 14,300 student addresses compiled into one database that can be extracted to a comma separated or tab delimited format? Yes
- Can the 800 routes be handed over in a soft copy such as a word document or excel file? PDF
- Are the 800 routes in a format such as driver direction's right and left turns that document stop order sequences? Yes, route reports document stop sequence, and there are options to have directions or no directions.
- Do the 6 contractors currently manage route schedules and daily requests for changes? No, all requests and changes go through CREC, and changes are then sent to contractors.
- How many counties make up the 43 school districts? 4 counties
- Of the 800 routes, how many runs make up one route? A run being defined as students on the bus serving one or more schools. A separate run is defined as when a bus departs a school empty and begins to pick up more students for another school.

27 AM buses are tiered
31 PM buses are tiered
The rest are not tiered with any other routes.
