Statutory Requirements

- No later than July 1, 2012
 - Appointment of *school-based* Safe School Climate **Specialist**
 - Appointment of *district-level* Safe School Climate **Coordinator**
 - Establishment of *school-based* Safe School Climate **Committee**
 - Can be a pre-existing committee
 - Must have at least one parent
 - Statute is silent on how often the committee meets

Statutory Requirements

- Section 10–222d–/ (P.A. 11-232) signed into law, July 13, 2011, retroactive to July 1, 2011
 - New definition immediately adopted
 - New reporting and investigation timeline requirements immediately in place
 - Annual training for all school employees and students

Statutory Requirements

- ***As of July 1, 2012, all components of the statute in place:***
 - Submission to CSDE of Safe School Climate Plan (Plan)
 - No later than January 1, 2012
 - 30 days after Plan adopted must be posted on LEA district Web site
 - Annually, provide Plan to each school employee
 - Plan must be in the Student Handbook

Statutory Requirements

- During the 2012 – 2013 school year
 - Implement Safe School Climate Assessments (SSCA) at the ***school level*** for students, faculty/staff and parents/guardians
 - SSCA is also referred to as School Climate Assessment Instrument (SCAI) in PDF/online survey; they are identical
 - Submit SSCA data to the CSDE no later than July 19, 2013
 - Submitted through the ED 166
 - Must get “permission” from the district Security Manager to input and submit data

SSCA Submission to the CSDE

- Purpose (from CSDE standpoint)
 - Report to the CT Legislature by statute annually, no later than February 1
 - For schools to analyze their data and set priorities
 - Identify statewide trends *in schools*
 - Provide targeted professional development and technical assistance
 - Assist with school climate improvement planning and implementation

The Two Memos

- To begin the process of collecting the statutorily required trend survey data, two memos were sent on May 31, 2013:
 - The Security Manager’s Memo
 - The Safe School Climate Coordinator Memo

Frequently Asked Questions

- Which User Name and Password is required to access the system?
 - The LEA Security Manager needs to assign a *unique* User Name and Password to gain access to the system.

Security Manager Memo

- Memo should be read by district Security Manager and district Safe School Climate Coordinator (and superintendent)
 - SSCA District User
 - SSCA Certifier
 - Gaining Access
 - Data Entry
 - Important SSCA System Notes

SSC Coordinator Responsibility

- Work with each school-based SSC Specialist to provide *school-level* SSCA data
- Coordinate with district Security Manager to identify individual(s) who will enter data into ED 166 “trend” survey
 - <https://csde.ct.gov> (third paragraph of Memo)
- Facilitate the submission of the school-level data to the CSDE
 - **Deadline is July 19, 2013** (*not* July 1 as indicated incorrectly on PDF of online survey)

SSC Coordinator Memo

- Assessing the quality of a school's climate under Section 10–222d–/ (P.A. 11-232)
- Safe School Climate Assessments
 - Guidance and instruments on CSDE Web site
 - Web site address in first paragraph of Memo
- The state “trend” survey
 - Allows the CSDE to *receive* your school-level SSCA data
- The PDF of the online survey
- Word version of the online survey

Frequently Asked Questions

- Links in the Coordinator Memo...where do they take you?
 - Longer link: to the CSDE-issued surveys and guidance Memo
 - First paragraph in Memo
 - Shorter link: to the ED 166 link to the SSCA “trend” survey
 - Third paragraph in Memo
 - Access only with “permission”

Frequently Asked Questions

- What are the requirements for surveying beyond this year?
 - Biennial submission statutorily, selected grades (*one grade per school*)
 - Best practice: *all grades, everyone, annually*
- Do we have to use the state-developed surveys in the next cycle?
 - Guidance will subsequently be provided for next cycle based upon this year's pilot submissions

State Trend Survey

- PDF/WORD document
 - Not identical to the interactive online survey
 - Similar content, different numeration
- Deadline is July 19, 2013
- Asks for information about students, parents/guardians and faculty/staff
- Most information given through drop-down and checked-in boxes

State Trend Survey

- Will provide a Word version of the online survey
 - Enable each Specialist to complete the information from each school on the computer, not long hand
 - Allow one person to enter and submit data in the online survey efficiently

State Trend Survey

- ***Must answer every question***
 - Survey will not permit final submission
 - Including N/A
 - Counts as answering the question
- All text boxes allow for ***up to 1,500 characters***
 - Approximately one paragraph
- ***Requires superintendent's certification prior to submission***

State Trend Survey

- Part I: Summarizes school-based SSCA
 - General information (questions 1 – 7)
 - School ID
 - Coordinator
 - Specialist
 - Survey used
 - Number of individuals who completed the survey (for all three groups)

State Trend Survey

- Part I: Summarizes school-based SSCA
 - Feedback in four areas (questions 8 – 11)
 - Asked for ***each of the three groups*** (up to three of the following, at least one)
 - School's climate ***strengths***
 - School's climate ***discrepancies***, including percentages
 - School's implementation ***challenges***
 - ***Areas that will be targeted for climate improvement***

State Trend Survey

- Part I: School Climate Improvement Plans
 - Questions 12 & 13
 - Asks if there is a plan for climate improvement based on this collected data
 - If yes, asks for anticipated barriers to implementation

State Trend Survey

- Part II: Questions that pertain to the report the CSDE must submit to the CT Legislature annually
 - Question 14: Perception of “positive school climate”
 - Defined in your own terms
 - Percentage of students
 - Percentage of parents/guardians
 - Percentage of faculty/staff

State Trend Survey

- Part II: Questions that pertain to the report the CSDE must submit to the CT Legislature annually
 - Questions 15 – 21:
 - Consequences given for verified acts of bullying
 - Training and programs in place
 - Climate improvement
 - Safe School Climate Committees

State Trend Survey

- Part II: Questions that pertain to the report the CSDE must submit to the CT Legislature annually
 - Questions 22 & 23:
 - How can the CSDE support *your* school climate improvement efforts?
 - Recommendations for the CSDE?
 - Up to three suggestions allowed for each of these two questions

Survey Completion: Questions

- How many surveys am I completing?
 - One “trend” survey per school
 - Example: 7 schools in district; 7 submissions (same template)
- How long does it take to complete the survey?
 - Approximately 30 – 40 minutes per school
 - May vary if data is not accessible or doing it/them in more than one step
 - Preparation
 - Entry

Survey Completion: Questions

- Should each Safe School Climate Specialist (school-based) complete the survey?
 - Each Specialist should be involved in the preparation, at least.
 - Up to each district to determine who enters the data and is given “permission.”
 - Coordinator enters all data
 - Administrative personnel enters all data
 - Specialist enters individual school data

Survey Completion: Suggestions

- Prior to going online, use the PDF/Word Survey copy to pull together what you need
 - Avoid being “surprised” by what is asked
- Be as specific as possible, but succinct
- Survey will allow “saving” information if not ready to submit
