FINAL DECISION AND ORDER

ISSUES:

1. Whether the Student's classification for eligibility for special education is appropriate.
2. Whether the Student has made appropriate progress in accomplishing his goals and objectives during the 2006-2007 and 2007-2008 school year.
3. Whether the Board's program for the Student which was implemented commencing spring 2007, and continuing into the 2007-2008 school year, is appropriate.
4. If not whether the Student shall be provided cognitive breaks, extended school day, and placement in elective courses including health, computer and art.
5. Whether the Board has appropriately implemented the IEP as to the number of hours and services provided for the 2006-2007 and 2007-2008 school years.
6. Whether the Board has committed procedural violations during the 2006-2007, 2007-2008 school years.

SUMMARY:

The Board received this request for hearing on November 14, 2007 and prehearing conferences were convened on November 21 and November 29. On December 28, prior to the first hearing date, the Parents submitted notification that this matter had settled.

FINAL DECISION AND ORDER:

The matter is **DISMISSED**.
