FINAL DECISION AND ORDER

ISSUES:

- 1. Did the Board deny Student FAPE for the 2017-18 school year, including related services and ESY?
- 2. If the Board did not provide Student FAPE for the 2017-18 school year, is the Little Keswick School the appropriate program?
- 3. If the Board did not provide and/or offer the Student FAPE for the 2017-18, should the Student be reimbursed for the tuition and related expenses of the Little Keswick School?
- 4. Is compensatory education an appropriate remedy

PROCEDURAL HISTORY/SUMMARY:

The Parents filed the Due Process Hearing Complaint on January 29, 2019. The Hearing Officer was appointed on January 31, 2019. A Pre-Hearing conference was held on February 7, 2019. The mailing date for the final decision is April 12, 2019. The Parents withdrew their complaint with prejudice on April 4, 2019.
