



Supports available to all students



Extended Time

- **50% extended time**, which is sometimes referred to as time and a half.
- **100% extended time**, which is sometimes referred to as double time.
- Students can receive extended time for the entire test, or they can receive extended time for just the math section or just for the SAT essay section.
- Self-pacing is not available with Extended time accommodations. Students must remain in the testing room for the entire length of time allotted for testing.

Reading/Seeing Text

- **MP3 Audio** – an audio version of the test is delivered through an online application. Students automatically received 100% extended time as well as additional time for the writing and language section.
- **Reader** – an adult will read the test to the student. This requires one-to-one testing.
- **Assistive Technology Compatible (ATC)** – a digital version of the test is delivered on a flash drive for use with screen readers and other technology; students automatically receive 100% extended time as well as additional time on the writing and language section.
- **Braille** – Students will receive Braille test books. For more information about format, contact the SSD office.

Recording Answers

- **Writer/Scribe** – With this accommodation, the student will have their answers transcribed onto the answer sheet by an adult. The student automatically receives 50% extended time and extra breaks on all sections.
- **Enlarged Answer Sheet** for students who require an enlarged answer sheet without bubbles.
- **Braillewriter** – typically requested with a Braille Accommodation, this accommodation is available for students who have a visual impairment.

Extra/Extended Breaks

- **Extra breaks** – students receive more breaks than typically provided during standard testing. Most students who need extra breaks take standard-length breaks that are given at scheduled times.
- **Extended breaks** – students receive longer breaks, which are typically twice the time of standard breaks.
- **Breaks as needed** – this is typically approved for students with certain medical conditions. These students are granted breaks as requested during the test.

Modified Setting

- **Small group setting** – a student can test in a smaller group setting than a large testing room with many students.
- **One-to-One Testing** – a single student tests in a room with a proctor.
- **Home/hospital setting** – a student with a disability that prevents him/her from attending school will be testing in an alternate location.

Other

- **American Sign Language** – Students will receive the test directions in ASL, provided by an adult.
- **Permission to Test Blood Sugar** – For students with diabetes.
- **Permission for Food/Medication** – For students with physical/medical disabilities.
