The voting device features two modes:
(1) a touchscreen display or
(2) audio navigation and selection with tactile keys and headset.

This system accommodates voters with impaired vision, restricted mobility, limited fine motor skills, or a wide range of cognitive, language, and literacy abilities.





VOTE USING TOUCHSCREEN DISPLAY

Easily navigate the touchscreen ballot by pressing the navigation buttons: Next Contest, Previous Contest, Ballot Review or Print Ballot.

Press your contest selections. A red checkmark will appear next to each selection. To change your vote, simply press again to deselect the contest selection.

Press the Ballot Review button for a summary of your selections. Press a contest to change a selection. Once ready, press Print Ballot.

The preprinted ballot will be marked with your selections.



VOTE USING THE AUDIO BALLOT

Voters use a telephone-style, tactile keypad with headset for voting navigation and selection.

Preview & Practice

Since the user interface for the audio ballot is a small 12-button keypad with the same layout as that of a telephone keypad, voters can call a toll-free number anytime from the comfort of their home to practice voting - browsing through a "Famous Names" ballot, making selections, reviewing the voted ballot, changing selections, etc.
