**I. TO MARK THIS BALLOT.**

Completely fill in each appropriate oval as shown. 

Use a black or blue pen or pencil.

Vote for candidates individually. Do not mark the party names in any way.

**II. TO VOTE FOR CANDIDATES.**

In most cases, only one mark or write-in vote is allowable in each column (that is, for each office). Mark the oval left of the name of each candidate for whom you wish to vote.

**III. TO WRITE IN A VOTE** for a registered write-in candidate for a particular office, use the write-in row spaces provided for this purpose. The space you use for writing in a person's name as a candidate must be directly below the column headed with the title of the office to which you wish this person elected. It will have the same number as shown in the column-heading for that office.
