SECRETARY MERRILL REMINDS ELIGIBLE CONNECTICUT VOTERS THAT ELECTION DAY REGISTRATION AVAILABLE NEXT TUESDAY

SECRETARY OF THE STATE INFORMS ALL ELIGIBLE CT VOTERS: THOSE NOT
YET REGISTERED CAN GO TO TOWN/CITY HALL ON ELECTION DAY, REGISTER
AND VOTE

HARTFORD: Secretary of the State Denise Merrill today is reminding all eligible Connecticut voters (any U.S. citizen residing in the state age 18 or older) not yet registered to vote that Election Day Registration will be available for the general election on Tuesday, November 4, 2014. Any eligible voter in Connecticut who wishes to cast a ballot but has not yet registered to vote is permitted to go to a central location in their city or town, present the proper identifying documents, register to vote, and cast a ballot. A complete list of Election Day Registration locations in each Connecticut city and town follows at the end of this news release. Connecticut became the 11th state to enact Election Day voter registration in 2012 when Governor Malloy signed into law Public Act 12-56 which was given final passage by the Connecticut General Assembly on May 5, 2012.

“Election Day Registration was so successful in 2013 – making it possible for thousands of new Connecticut voters to cast a ballot when we worked with local officials to implement this long overdue reform,” said Secretary Merrill, Connecticut’s chief elections official. “We expect voter turnout to be considerably higher than it was last year, and therefore there will likely be higher demand for Election Day Registration from eligible voters not yet registered. My office has once again worked closely with Registrars of Voters across Connecticut to make sure municipalities are ready to accommodate those voters who for whatever reason have not yet registered prior to Election Day. We want to give every eligible voter in Connecticut can make their voice heard on the crucial issues facing our state and country as voters head to the polls next Tuesday.”

Under Connecticut election law, Election Day Registration permits anyone to register and vote in person on Election Day if he or she meets the eligibility requirements for voting in this state and is either: (1) not already a registered voter or (2) is registered in one municipality but wants to change his or her registration because he or she currently resides in another municipality. By law, a person is eligible to register and vote if he or she is (1) a U. S. citizen, (2) age 18 or older, and (3) a bona fide resident of the municipality in which he or she applies to register to vote. Those wishing to register and vote on Election Day must appear in person at the designated location at town or city hall and declare under oath that they have not previously voted in the election. They must complete the application for voter registration and provide documents to prove their identity and residence.

Once the new voter is properly registered, the Registrars of Voters must provide a special Election Day Registration (EDR) ballot and envelope to the voter and record its issuance to that particular voter. The voter must (1) declare under oath that he or she did not previously vote in the election and (2) sign an affirmation that is printed on the back of the security envelope. The new voter must secretly mark the ballot in the presence of the registrars or their designees, place it in the EDR envelope, and deposit the envelope in a secured EDR ballot box.

Polls will be open from 6:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. on Tuesday November 4, 2014 for the general election all Connecticut cities and towns. Secretary Merrill encourages voters to go online at www.sots.ct.gov/vote to find out more information about Election Day Registration, and view sample ballots from their city or town.
